Sixth Grade Humanities (ELA/Social Studies) 2024-2025

Welcome!!!!

We are happy to have your child in our classrooms this year. Many exciting and educational activities have been planned to make sure your child has an enriched and enjoyable year.

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Communication

In order to have consistent communication, we use **Google Classroom and ClassTag.** It is important that parents/guardians are signed up to receive email notifications from Google Classroom about their child. When in doubt, check your "To Do" list in Google Classroom or contact your teacher through email or School Status Connect (ClassTag).

Students will use their **chromebooks** every day, so they need to be **charged and ready to go** at the beginning of each day. Every Monday they will be given a checklist for the week of lessons and assignments. The student and parents are expected to use Google Classroom and Family Access as a way to keep track of **progress** on assignments/assessments and on any **missing** assignments/assessments. Your Family access code can be obtained from the office.

You can access our emails by going to the CMS website and clicking on "teachers". You can also contact us by calling the school before or after school hours: (509) 782-2001. We will be available most mornings before 8:10, and most afternoons after lunch. Please call or email if you would like to set up a time to Zoom or meet in person.

Absences

Attendance is taken each period. If a student misses a class period, the school needs to be notified of the reason. If you know ahead of time that a student will be absent, please call the office and pre-arrange the absence with them. If a student pre-arranges an absence and is given homework, it is their responsibility to complete all homework given and turn it in on their return to school.

When a student is absent, please check their Google Classrooms for any homework assignments. It is the student's responsibility to check in with the teacher when they return for any homework questions they may have. It is the responsibility of the student to reschedule work or tests/quizzes that have been missed due to an absence. A student is given one day for each day absent in which to make-up their work. Assignments

Assignments are given in each subject and graded on a 4 point proficiency scale. These assignments are important as they are evidence of the student working toward a standard. Students will be given guided practice time during class. If a child is struggling or needs extra help, then they need to reach out to the teacher.

Grading Scale (Standards Based Reporting)

6th grade will continue using a Standards Based Reporting System using a 4 level scale.

- 4 = Distinguished (Exceeds Standard)
- 3 = Proficient (Meets Standard)
- 2 = Approaching (Partially Proficient)
- 1 = Beginning (Well below proficiency)

Late Work

Students are responsible for turning work in on time. No assignment will be accepted unless it is complete. All assignments will be given a "Due Date." Work turned in after that time will be considered late unless pre arrangements have been made.
