ASSESSMENT/REPORTING

Students will be assessed on their skills within the following four standards:

1. Individual Musicianship:

The following skills fall under this standard. Various assessments and assignments will be used throughout the year to determine your skills in this area.

- Sight reading How well can you read and perform music you have seen for the first time?
- *Technique* How well do you know your scales and rhythms? Which instrument-specific skills are gradually showing improvement in?
- *Musicality* How well do you use dynamics, articulations, and phrasing in your playing? How well do you blend and balance with your section and the entire band?
- *Musical Knowledge* How well do you understand form and structure in the music we are playing? Do you know the musical terms that are indicated in your music? What do you know about the background on the music we are playing?

2. Ensemble Musicianship

The following skills fall under this standard:

- Concerts and Performances We perform throughout the year in formal concerts, school assemblies, and in-class recitals.
- Sectionals and small ensembles Occasionally, we work in small groups on our full band music, or on small ensemble music.
- Execution of Performance music How well do you know the music that we are performing as a group or small ensemble?

3. Daily Work and Practice

The following skills fall under this standard:

- Assigned practice Students will need to practice on their own to be able to effectively perform our ensemble music. We will have various assignments throughout the year to check on this practice.
- *In class assignments* We have various assignments that need to be completed and returned so you can receive feedback on your learning.

4. Classroom Behaviors

The following skills fall under this standard:

- Participation, Effort, and Preparedness Students will have a weekly self reflection calendar on which students must determine their level of effort and participation. Students will be checked daily to make sure they have their instrument, music and necessary accessories.
- Correspondence and communication Students will have permission forms, concert reminders, and other forms of communication that must return to school with a parent signature.

Performances

We have several performances throughout the school year. Some of these occur during the school day, but some occur outside of school. We prepare for each of these performances several weeks, and therefore are very important for all band students to attend. It is impossible to recreate a performance situation for students who do not attend. Please mark these dates in your calendar. If for some reason a student cannot attend a performance, please notify the director as soon as possible so other arrangements can be made for your performance assessment.

Thursday, May 30th @ 7:30pm – Spring Concert (6th Grade only)

Concert Attire – Must be worn to each performance (please plan ahead)

Boys: Black Shoes, Black Socks, Black dress pants, White Dress Shirt, no tie Girls: Black Shoes, Black socks/stockings, Black pants/skirt, white blouse/top *Please, no T-shirts or black jeans*

Please plan ahead so that you have the appropriate attire for performances. If you have problems obtaining correct concert attire, please contact Mr. Chalmers.

Instrument Care

Proper care of instruments is essential to your success as a musician. Instrument inspections will occur periodically. Clean your instrument monthly, and use the appropriate care products. Mouthpieces can be washed out in the music room sink and this should happen every day. Each student should have the following care products:

- Flute: Cleaning swab and/or rod, cleaning cloth
- Oboe, Clarinet, Bassoon, Saxophones: Cleaning swab of some type, cork grease, and at least <u>2 extra reeds</u>. If you choose to buy a box of reeds (usually cheaper to buy in bulk) leave the box at home and only take 2 or 3 for class so they are safe and not misplaced.
- Trumpet, F. Horn: Valve oil, some type of slide grease, cleaning snake, cleaning cloth.

- <u>Euphonium, Tuba:</u> You are using school instruments, so you will be graded on how well you maintain your instrument's slides and valves. You are responsible for knowing where valve oil and slide grease are kept in the room.
- Trombone: Slide *cream*, tuning slide grease, spray bottle cleaning cloth.
- <u>Percussionists</u>: Appropriate drum sticks, practice pad and metronome (I only need to see these at the beginning of the year). Percussionists need to bring a stick bag to class every day with the following sticks: Soft timpani/cymbal mallets, hard plastic bell/xylo. mallets, snare drum sticks (2B or equivalent), yarn wrapped marimba mallets. Percussionists are responsible for maintaining the trap table, and other percussion areas. Percussionists need to label their sticks, mallets, and stick bags.

Where to get instruments and accessories

There are several options for obtaining an instrument and any necessary instrument accessories. This will need to be taken care of within the first couple weeks of school so students will not fall behind.

- 2. Attend an instrument rental night. These are after-school events where music retailers come to our music room for your convenience. We try to do an evening in the fall and one in the spring. Ted Brown music attend these events and have all the instruments, accessories, and materials (books) that are needed for class. The date for this year's rental night will be announced in the first couple days of school.
- 3. Borrow or purchase an instrument from someone you know. Keep in mind you will probably still need to get the necessary accessories and materials (book).
- 4. Search online for an instrument. Online resources such as online music stores, craigslist, and ebay are excellent ways to obtain an instrument.
- 5. If you have a problem obtaining an instrument, contact Mr. Chalmers.

Classroom Rules

- All rules outlined in the middle school student handbook apply to band class.
- No gum, food, or drink (except water) in the band room.
- Take care of the instruments in the room.
- No talking or playing out of turn.
