Welcome to Choir!

I am excited to begin this year with you! This syllabus will inform you of your responsibilities as a student - or as parents/guardians of students - enrolled in the choir program at CHS. Choir is a performance-based class, which means that our goals and standards are driven towards concert and in-class performances. I am SO excited to get to connect and create with you! Please read through this document carefully so that you and your parents/guardians completely understand the expectations that exist for you in the choir program.

What Choir is About

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In a choral classroom, students learn a variety of skills while working together to achieve an outcome. Teamwork, leadership, compassion, and accountability are only a few of the things that choir students work on throughout the year. Very few classes allow students to work completely *together* to achieve a group goal. In our daily work this year, we will strive to become knowledgeable and self-sufficient musicians as we learn to make wonderful music!

Some of the concepts (as per NAfME Music standards) covered will include:

- Core musical concepts (Theory, Ear Training)
- Live rehearsals
- Performance
- Reflection and Analysis
- Music History (styles, composers, etc)
- Music Technology (apps, programs)
- Arts Enrichment (uses for music, future planning)

Classroom Rules

- Listen and follow directions
- Raise your hand to speak or to get out of your seat
- Keep hands and feet to yourself
- Respect the teacher, classmates, and yourself
- All rules outlined in the CMS Student Handbook will apply to the Choir class.

Daily Participation and Attendance

As important as individual practice is for developing skills, daily participation in group activities is equally important as an active application of those practiced skills. Due to choir being a performance class, students will be expected to participate and try their best in class every day. If a student misses time in class, they will need to communicate with Miss Bronson about missed rehearsal time. Students AND Parents are free to email Ms. Bronson if they have any questions.

Required Class Materials:

- Chromebook: A lot of class activities will be using Google Classroom. Come prepared with it fully charged.
 - Generally, it will be used on Late Start days!
- Music Folder: Will be provided for you; stored with class set.
- Pencil: Can be stored in your music folder.

Performance Participation

CMS Choir Grading Guidelines

Assessment/Reporting Policy

All grading practices will follow the Standards-Based Grading method of a four-point scale for skill and standard proficiency. The scale, aligned directly with learning standards, gives the student, teacher and parents a clear picture of how each student is progressing on a set of important skills and standards, as well as work completion and classroom behaviors. Each assignment is tied to a specific standard and will be reported with the following vocabulary.

Standards Proficiency Reporting Scale

- **DIS Distinguished** (4) exceeds grade level standard
- PRO Proficient (3) meets grade level standard
- APP Approaching (2) needs assistance to meet grade level standard
- **BEG Beginning** (1) work is below grade level standard
- **NE No Evidence** Zero participation/classwork submitted.

Students will be assessed on standards regarding both Individual and Ensemble Musicianship, as well as their daily work and practice and classroom behaviors in accordance with Cashmere Middle School grading policy. Each category is broken down into specific learning standards, listed below.
