ACADEMIC PROGRESS TOWARDS GRADUATION

According to the laws of the State of Washington (WAC 180-40-210), "it is the responsibility and duty of each student to pursue his/her course of studies, comply with written rules of a common school district..."

Therefore, in compliance with the laws of the State of Washington, students not making sufficient progress towards graduation, (students who fail more than 25% of their classes) at Cashmere High School shall be placed on academic probation at the end of each semester grading period.

The probation period shall last one semester.

The student's parents will be notified by letter at the beginning of the academic probation period. The student will also be referred to the counseling office. The counselor will also contact the parent or guardian to determine and inform them of the correctives that need to take place. The counselor may refer the student to Special Services, Chapter I, LAP, Alcohol and Substance Abuse Counseling, or tutoring.

If at the end of the probationary period the student is still putting forth no effort and the suggested correctives have not been attempted by the student, he/she will meet with the principal, assistant principal and counselor and be suspended for the following semester or until he/she demonstrates improvement in his/her academic performance.

The principal's decision with regard to academic suspension may be appealed in writing to the Superintendent of Schools within ten (10) working days.

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
