On March 13th, Governor Inslee issued an executive order closing all public and private schools due to COVID-19. Included in his mandate, was the directive for schools to continue to offer/provide "essential services" including:

- Child Care for Medical Professionals and First-Responders
- Continuation of Student Meal Service
- Extended Learning Opportunities K-12

General Update:

Child Care:

Starting Monday, March 23rd, child care services for children of Medical Personnel and First-Responders started. The child care is provided at Vale Elementary and runs from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. daily. If you have questions, please contact Rhett Morgan at rmorgan@cashmere.wednet.edu.

Student Meal Service:

Starting Thursday, March 19th, continuation of our student meal program was in place and operational. For students that live outside of the city limits, we are running our "late start" bus routes and delivering meals at each stop. For students living inside the city limits, meals can be picked up onsite at Vale Elementary from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. daily. Initially, just over 600 meals were distributed on the first day of service. That number has now risen to just over a 1000 meals per day. K-12 Extended Learning:

The Cashmere School District is committed to providing extended learning opportunities during the closure. Our staff has worked extremely hard to transition from a traditional learning system into a "distance" learning system. This is challenging work for all involved, but we are committed to providing learning opportunities and resources for all students. In addition, we also have in mind our student's social and emotional health and have asked our staff to connect with our families and students using email, technology, phones, etc. If you have questions about student learning, I encourage you to contact your student's teacher(s).
