Board Work Session
February 5, 2018

CALL TO ORDER:

Chairman Tom Christensen called the meeting to order at 6:30 AM in the Cashmere High School Library.

DECLARATION OF QUORUM:

Board members Roger Perleberg and Ted Snodgrass were present. There were two others present. Superintendent Johnson was absent.

1.0 Flag Salute

1.1. Chairman Christensen led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2.0 Approval of the Agenda – On a motion by Roger Perleberg, the Board approved the agenda as presented.

3.0 Reports, Correspondence and Program –

3.1. Board Report – There was no board report.

3.2. Superintendent's Report – There was no Superintendent's Report.

3.2.1 Vale After School Programs Update – Vale Principal, Sean McKenna, updated the Board on After School Programs offered to Vale students. He stated that the “Kid Zone” continues to thrive; targeting kids going home to an empty home or non-structured environment. The program currently services 20 students and includes two staff members and about 10 HS students who volunteer their time to help. The activities provided to students range from individual help with homework and reading to a jump rope program.

Board member, Ted Snodgrass shared that his own child, participates in the “Kid Zone” program and has been very happy with it.

Principal McKenna also gave an update on the EL Afters Program. He shared that students are now getting the instruction missed, due to pull out interventions during the day, afterschool. He stated that a combined over 100 students are currently being served in both afterschool programs.

3.2.2 School-Based Clinic Update – Vale Principal, Sean McKenna, updated the Board on the Confluence School-Based Clinic. He stated that everyone

from Confluence has been great to work with adding that he continues to meet with their health staff once a month with plans to add to the existing services provided. Principal McKenna shared the clinic has served 24 patients since opening, a total 74 visits, many of which were repeat visits. The School-Based Clinic is a place where children are treated for sick and acute care needs as well as well child checks and routine screenings. The School-Based Clinic also sees children for counseling services with a focus on specific behaviors and emotions. Principal McKenna informed the Board that the next goal is to work with Confluence Health, to communicate health related topics with families and develop the next phase of the clinic.

4.0 Adjournment

On a motion by Roger Perleberg and there being no further business to discuss, Chairman Christensen adjourned the meeting at 6:55 AM.
