






CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

As you can see, construction of our new 6.5 classrooms is well underway. We anticipate full completion by mid-December. Until then there will be some minor inconveniences with traffic, parking, and student pick up but rest assure, student safety will remain our number one priority. Please consider student pick up/parking at the city pool area or one of the nearby side streets. Huge thank you to you, our community, for supporting this building project!





This decision to offer after-school childcare services is based upon a combination of research and feedback collected through the Early Childhood Education on literature and Vale Elementary student surveys completed through our leadership program. Many parents and employers are quick to cite the lack of affordable, high quality after-school childcare for school-age children as a significant challenge. By offering childcare services, the Cashmere School District is hoping to:

- --> Provide the children with access to a safe, child-centered setting
- --> Reduce transitions for students and parents throughout the day

- -->Increase student participation in enriching, highinterest activities
- -->Support working families and employers

In addition to examining parent and community feedback, we looked at the research associated with after-school childcare and enrichment. According to the Harvard Family Research Project, "After-school programs are a powerful influence in the lives of young people. They offer safe spaces where youth receive personal attention, find academic support, form friendship, discover their passions and develop new talents. Research confirms that high-quality after-school programs show positive outcomes for young people, including academic achievement, civic and social development and reduced risk-taking behaviors."



Frequently Asked Questions

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

Participating families will be asked to pay a monthly fee based on a sliding- scale system. Fees collected will be used to cover the costs associated with staffing, supplies, transportation, and a healthy snack. Rates are:

\$30 per month for families qualifying for free meal services \$60 per month for families qualifying for reduced-cost meal services \$120 per month for full-pay families

WHAT TIME DOES IT BEGIN AND END?

It will begin at 3:00 p.m. and end at 5:00 p.m.

WHAT IS THE RATIO OF STUDENTS TO EACH SUPERVISOR?

15 students per supervisor for children in grades K through 3. For grades 4 through 6, the ratio will be 20 students per supervisor.

WILL TRANSPORTATION BE PROVIDED?

Parent pick up and limited transportation routes are available.

WHAT ACTIVITIES WILL BE OFFERED AS PART OF THE CHILDCARE PROGRAM?

Some examples include: games, art projects, outdoor play, independent reading, and homework.





ARE "DROP-INS" ALLOWED?

Not at this time. As a starting place, we are prioritizing childcare for students needing regular services. Parents of participating students will be asked to pay a monthly fee (see rates left). We'll assess our ability to allow for drop-ins after the first trimester.

HOW DO I ENROLL MY CHILD?

Beginning Monday, August 21, enrollment information will be available at the Vale Elementary School office. We will also post enrollment information on our district website.

WHAT IF I CAN'T PAY FOR THE MONTHLY FEE?

If you do not have the funds to pay for this program, a scholarship for one or more months can be applied for through Cashmere Cares. Contact Scott Griffith (below) to request a scholarship application.

IS TUITION ADJUSTED IF YOU QUALIFY FOR PROGRAMS LIKE MIGRANT OR MCKINNEY-VENTO (HOMELESS)?

Yes. Tuition will be waived for student qualifying for either program. Please indicated your status in these programs on the enrollment packet.

DO CHILDREN NEED TO BRING A SNACK?

No. Snacks will be provided as part of the cost of the program.

Preschoolers will explore shapes, colors, counting, playing games and identifying letters, numbers and each other's names. 
Math - our first unit in math focuses on increasing addition and subtraction skills and strategies, number sense, and rounding.


















EXCUSED AND UNEXCUSED ABSENCES

Students are expected to attend all assigned classes each day. Upon enrollment and at the beginning of each school year, the district shall inform students and their parents/guardians of this expectation, the benefits of regular school attendance, the consequences of truancy, the role and responsibility of the district in regard to truancy, and resources available to assist the student and their parents and guardians in correcting truancy. The district will also make this information available online and will take reasonable steps to ensure parents can request and be provided such information in languages in which they are fluent. Parents will be required to date and acknowledge review of this information online or in writing.

Excused Absences

Regular school attendance is necessary for mastery of the educational program provided to students of the district. At times, students may be appropriately absent from class. School staff will keep a record of absence and tardiness, including a record of excuse statements submitted by a parent/guardian, or in certain cases, students, to document a student's excused absences. The following principles will govern the development and administration of attendance procedures within the district:

- A. The following are valid excuses for absences:
 - Participation in a district or school approved activity or instructional program;
 - •Illness, health condition or medical appointment (including, but not limited to, medical, counseling, dental or optometry);
 - Family emergency, including, but not limited to, a death or illness in the family;
 - Religious or cultural purpose including observance of a religious or cultural holiday or participation in religious or cultural instruction;
 - Court, judicial proceeding or serving on a jury;
 - Post-secondary, technical school or apprenticeship program visitation, or scholarship interview;
 - •State-recognized search and rescue activities consistent with RCW

28A.225.055:

- •Absence directly related to the student's homeless status;
- •Absence resulting from a disciplinary/corrective action. (e.g., short-term or long-term suspension, emergency expulsion); and
- •Principal (or designee) and parent, guardian, or emancipated youth mutually agreed upon approved activity.

The school principal (or designee) has the authority to determine if an absence meets the above criteria for an excused absence.

Unexcused Absences

A. Any absence from school for the majority of hours or periods in an average school day is unexcused unless it meets one of the criteria above for an excused absence.

- B. As a means of instilling values of responsibility and personal accountability, a student whose absence is not excused will experience the consequences of his/her absence. A student's grade may be affected if a graded activity or assignment occurs during the period of time when the student is absent.
- C. The school will notify a student's parent or guardian in writing or by telephone whenever the student has failed to attend school after one unexcused absence within any month during the current school year. The notification will include the potential consequences of additional unexcused absences.
- D. A conference with the parent or guardian will be held after two unexcused absences within any month during the current school year. A student may be suspended or expelled for habitual truancy. Prior to suspension or expulsion, the parent will be notified in writing in his/her primary language that the student has unexcused absences. A conference will be scheduled to determine what corrective measures should be taken to ameliorate the cause for the student's absences from school. If the parent does not attend the conference, the parent will be notified of the steps the district has decided to take to reduce the student's absences.

E. Not later than the student's fifth unexcused absence in a month the district will enter into an agreement with the student and parents that establishes school attendance requirements, refer the student to a community truancy board or file a petition and affidavit with the juvenile court alleging a violation of RCW 28A.225.010.

F. If such action is not successful, the district will file a petition and affidavit with the juvenile court alleging a violation of RCW 28A.225.010 by the parent, student or parent and student no later than the seventh unexcused absence within any month during the current school year or upon the tenth unexcused absence during the current school year.

G. All suspensions and/or expulsions will be reported in writing to the superintendent within 24 hours after imposition.

DISCRIMINATION

Cashmere School District does not discriminate in any programs or activities on the basis of sex, race, creed, religion, color, national origin, age, veteran or military status, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, disability, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal and provides equal access to the Boy Scouts and other designated youth groups. SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Students and staff are protected against sexual harassment by anyone in any school program or activity, including on the school campus, on the school bus, or off-campus during a school-sponsored activity.

Sexual harassment is unwelcome behavior or communication that is sexual in nature when:

- •A student or employee is led to believe that he or she must submit to unwelcome sexual conduct or communications in order to gain something in return, such as a grade, a promotion, a place on a sports team, or any educational or employment decision, or
- •The conduct substantially interferes with a student's educational performance, or creates an intimidating or hostile educational or employment environment.

Examples of Sexual Harassment:

- Pressuring a person for sexual favors
- •Unwelcome touching of a sexual nature
- ·Writing graffiti of a sexual nature
- •Distributing sexually explicit texts, e-mails, or pictures
- •Making sexual jokes, rumors, or suggestive remarks
- Physical violence, including rape and sexual assault

You can report sexual harassment

to any school staff member or to the district's Title IX Officer, who is listed above. You also have the right to file a complaint (see below). COMPLAINT OPTIONS: DISCRIMINATION AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT

If you believe that you or your child have experienced unlawful discrimination, discriminatory harassment, or sexual harassment at school, you have the right to file a complaint.

Before filing a complaint, you can discuss your concerns with your child's principal or with the school district's Section 504 Coordinator, Title IX Officer, or Civil Rights Coordinator, who are listed above. This is often the fastest way to revolve your concerns.

Complaint to the School District Step 1. Write Our Your Complaint In most cases, complaints must be filed within one year from the date of the incident or conduct that is the subject of the complaint. A complaint must be in writing. Be sure to describe the conduct or incident, explain why you believe discrimination, discriminatory harassment, or sexual harassment has taken place, and describe what actions you believe

the district should take to resolve the problem. Send your written complaint—by mail, fax, email, or hand delivery—to the district superintendent or civil rights compliance coordinator.

Step 2: School District Investigates Your Complaint

Once the district receives your written complaint, the coordinator will give you a copy of the complaint procedure and make sure a prompt and thorough investigation takes place. The superintendent or designee will respond to you in writing within 30 calendar days—unless you agree on a different time period. If your complaint involves exceptional circumstances that demand a lengthier investigation, the district will notify you in writing to explain why staff need a time extension and the new date for their written response.

Step 3: School District Responds to Your Complaint

In its written response, the district will include a summary of the results of the investigation, a determination of whether or not the district failed to comply with civil rights laws, notification that you can appeal this determination, and any measures necessary to bring the district into compliance with civil rights laws. Corrective measures will be put into effect within 30 calendar days after this written response—unless you agree to a different time period.

Appeal to the School District

If you disagree with the school district's

decision, you may appeal to the school district's board of directors. You must file a notice of appeal in writing to the secretary of the school board within 10 calendar days after you received the school district's response to your complaint. The school board will schedule a hearing within 20 calendar days after they received your appeal, unless you agree on a different timeline. The school board will send you a written decision within 30 calendar days after the district received your notice of appeal. The school board's decision will include information about how to file a complaint with the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI).

Complaint to OSPI

If you do not agree with the school district's appeal decision, state law provides the option to file a formal complaint with the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI). This is a separate complaint process that can take place if one of these two conditions has occurred: (1) you have completed the district's complaint and appeal process, or (2) the district has not followed the complaint and appeal process correctly.

You have 20 calendar days to file a complaint to OSPI from the day you received the decision on your appeal. You can send your written complaint to the Equity and Civil Rights Office at OSPI:

Districtwide Notice About Lunches:

To help parents with the busy dayto-day tasks needed with schoolaged children, Cashmere School District offers a grace period when lunch money is forgotten. This grace period allows students to charge meals to their school lunch account until they bring money from home. Parents are still responsible for repaying the charges accrued during the grace period. While we strongly discourage meal charges, we understand that an occasional emergency makes it necessary. It is important to make sure your contact information stays current with the school district so we can communicate more efficiently regarding your child's lunch account.

Parents will be notified and asked for prompt payment after three

charges and all charges must be paid in 10 days. If there is difficulty paying for student lunches, Cashmere School District encourages parents to complete the Application for Free and Reduced-Price meals, which is available at each school. For Elementary level: We will serve any student who has a negative balance of \$6.00 a lunch consisting of milk and cheese sandwich until the balance is paid.

Cashmere School District Highly Capable Notification

At this time, Cashmere School District is soliciting nominations from the community of students that are believed to have a high capacity to learn quickly, deeply, and/or broadly, so that we can better provide an individualized educational service to each of our students. Students nominated through this process will be considered for services to meet their needs based upon screening and assessment with the permission of their parent/guardian.

Definition of highly capable students means those students who:

Perform or show potential for performing at significantly advanced academic levels when compared with others of their age, experiences, or environments.

- (1) Capacity to learn with unusual depth of understanding, to retain what has been learned, and to transfer learning to new situations;
- (2) Capacity and willingness to deal with increasing levels of abstraction and complexity earlier than their chronological peers;
- (3) Creative ability to make unusual connections among ideas and concepts;
- (4) Ability to learn quickly in their area(s) of intellectual strength; and
- (5) Capacity for intense concentration and/or focus. (WAC 392-170-035, WAC 392-170-036)

Forms to make such nominations can be obtained at the Cashmere School District website and in the school office. In order to be considered for identification for the coming school year, nominations should be returned to the building secretary and should reach us by April 21, 2017.
